

Role Profile: Digital and Creative Arts Teacher

- **4.** Maintaining accurate and detailed records of pupil progress and attainment and reporting on same.
- 5. Completing reports and references on individuals or groups as required.
- 6. Fully responsible for the pastoral welfare of pupils under care, both at school and when offsite
- 7. Contribute to the extra-curricular activities and be fully involved in the wider aspects of our school
