- Promote and ensure consistent pupil involvement in the pupil rewards system across all three strands.
- Write reports and advise at Parents' Evenings as required and communicate effectively to parents about the progress of their child.

- Supervise pupils on school trips and visits, as required.
- Attend Admissions related events, including Open Mornings
